Board of Commissioners Met with ARPA Recipients

At a Committee of the Whole meeting the County of Saginaw Board of Commissioners welcomed ARPA recipients to give an update on their projects.

Hurley Coleman with the Saginaw County Community Action Committee (CAC) spoke about two projects. The first project includes building repairs, expansion of the community pantry and learning center modifications to the CAC. The second project is the home repair project which aims to help homeowners with home repairs in multiple municipalities in Saginaw County.

Joe Ruthig from Chesaning Township provided an update on the completion of the ADA kayak launches in Chesaning Township and the Village of Chesaning.

Rob Brown with First Ward offered an update on the completed renovations and repairs to the community center as well as programming updates.

Abbey Stemple offered an update on the housing project which aims to build 10-16 new homes which will be offered to households with incomes up to 120% of the area median income.

PRESCRIPTIONS

- Medications you take every day such as insulin, heart medications, and asthma inhalers – rotate periodically to keep medications current
- Medical supplies such as glucose and blood pressure equipment and supplies

NON-PRESCRIPTION DRUGS

- Aspirin/acetaminophen/ibuprofen
- Anti-diarrhea medication
- Antacid
- Laxative
- Allergy medication
- Cold/flu medication

Where can I find these items?

Local pharmacies will have most of these items, including ready-made First Aid Kits.

How much will this cost?

The cost will depend on the number of items you need to purchase to complete your kit. A good ready-made First Aid Kit can be purchased for around \$20.00.

Tips for success.....

Store your kit in a convenient place known to everyone in your household. Keep items in an easy to carry waterproof container. Have a first aid manual on hand and learn CPR. Don't forget to keep a kit in your car and at work.

Rethink your kit and household needs at least once a year. Replace batteries, update clothes, etc.

SCHD Receives Prestigious MDHHS Director's Award for Leadership in Creating and Sustaining BWell Saginaw

SCHD received the Michigan Department of Health & Human Services (MDHHS) Director's Award for "groundbreaking work in community health transformation."

We received the award – which includes a beautiful traveling trophy and \$1,000 check – at the 2025 Michigan Premier Public Health Conference in Muskegon last month.

In presenting the award, MDHHS noted that BWell Saginaw is more than a program – rather a "united movement" of 12 organizations in Saginaw determined to become one of Michigan's Top 25 healthiest communities. Led by SCHD as a neutral convener, the BWell Partner Coalition is creating a culture of health where everyone – regardless of background – can live, work, play and thrive.

The award was established by MDHHS to recognize local health departments for using innovative approaches to improve health, well-being and equity.

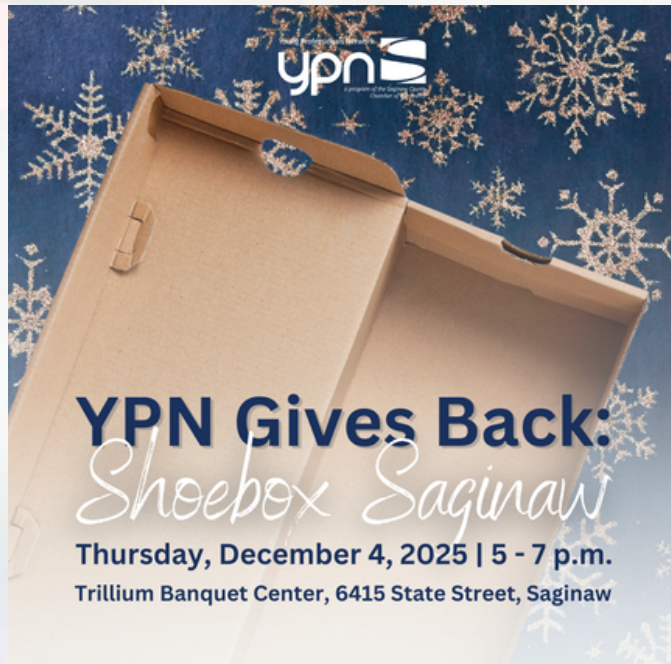
BWell Saginaw caught the eye of MDHHS because of the "Healthier Me" podcast, Step Up & BWell initiative in county schools, ABCs of Safe Sleep campaign, BWell Strides Toward Wellness Race Series, and BWell Youth Mental Healthlopedia.

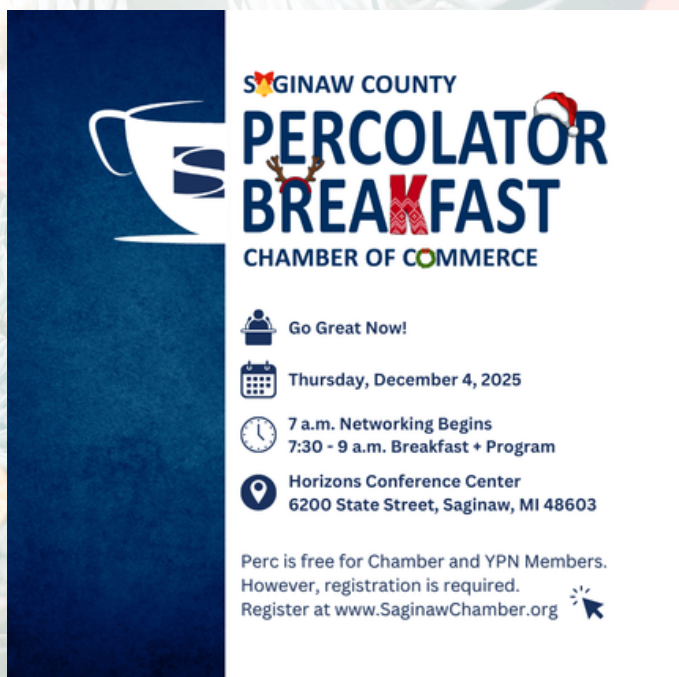

You may work remotely on a regular basis or you may have been mandated to work remotely due to unexpected circumstances. Either way, working from home can feel much different from working in an office.

Keep your data safe by creating a secure workspace, maintaining digital security, and by following the same best practices that you would in the office. Let's take a closer look at each of these ideas:

Create a Secure Workspace

- Have a clear understanding of the hardware and software required for your job, and know whether or not your organization will be providing those resources.
- Find a comfortable and private space with minimal distractions. This will help with both productivity and security—you don't want anyone taking a peek at your screen!
- Keep information safe by putting important documents away, shredding anything that is no longer needed, and by locking your computer when you are not at your desk.

Maintain Digital Security

- If you're using your personal computer, make a separate user account with a password that is specifically for work. Don't let anyone else use this account.



- If you're using a computer provided by your organization, only use it for work purposes and never give someone else access.
- Most routers come with a default username and password that are public knowledge. Ensure your internet connection is secure by changing this to a unique password.

Maintain Office Best Practices

- Understand your organization's work from home policies. For example, if your organization requires the use of a virtual private network (VPN), you should know how to connect to the VPN and who to contact if you have any questions or complications.
- Use a unique, strong password for any website or program that requires a login. Never use the same password twice. Using a password manager application is recommended.
- Stay alert and think before you click! Always be skeptical of requests for sensitive information.

Keeping security a priority while working from home will ensure the safety of yourself, your coworkers, your customers, and your organization as a whole.

SCCMHA Releases Findings From Community Needs Assessment Survey

SCCMHA presented the results of their Community Needs Assessment survey following an effort to connect with the public, community partners and staff to gain a better understanding of behavioral health needs in the Saginaw County community.

The Community Needs Assessment survey sought insight into the most pressing behavioral health disorders, knowledge about awareness and navigation to care access and treatment, what barriers are being experienced as well as potential improvements in service access, delivery and partnerships.

The findings of the survey showed top needs of focus in the community to be substance use disorder treatment, accessibility to behavioral healthcare services, and equity gaps regarding poverty, unstable housing, transportation and stigma.

Access to care due to lack of insurance, high costs and limited availability of providers lead to underserved populations, as well as stigma and discrimination in marginalized communities.

Results from this survey will be crucial to SCCMHA's plans going forward on how to best meet these needs in the coming year.
